In order to determine a vision of the future we must determine who we are now. Our next step is keeping church officers and committees busy this fall. They are revising the church bylaws to reflect the way our church is currently operating. It is a large but exciting project and everyone should see the results in time to review the changes before voting at the Annual Meeting.

Deacons Kick Off "Who is My Neighbor" Project

The Diaconate is undertaking a "Who is My Neighbor" project, based on a workshop at last spring's UCC Super Saturday. If you were in church on April 28, you heard about this in Pam Foote's message. The idea is to learn more about ourselves, the people with whom we engage, and those we'd like to engage. By finding out what we and they believe our community needs, and what skills or talents we and they have to meet those needs, we can determine the niche that is best for us to adopt. Beginning this month, members of the Diaconate will meet with TCC boards, committees and other groups, such as the choirs and Bible Study group, to ask three questions:

- What do you personally need, or wish was available?
- What does our community need?
- What are the strengths and gifts that you/TCC bring or could bring to our community?

The deacons are also happy to meet with individuals who would be interested in answering these questions. You can even send us an email with your answers to these questions. Our goal is to complete our internal interviews, as well as interviews with the next "circle," those who use our facilities (Scouts, yoga, Camera Club, Came to Believe, etc.) prior to the annual meeting in January. The Banner Fund




Remember the last time you went someplace
