Dear Church,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
(Romans 1:7b)

Somehow over the years, we have put more emphasis on the outward appearance of Advent than we have on the inward process of Lent. Is it no wonder? The time of preparation in Lent does not have the glitz and glamor of Advent. It is all dust, sackcloth and ashes. It is reflection, self-examination, and repentance. It is fasting, action and prayer. It is a time when God prepares us to be Easter people.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday when we reflect on the forgiveness God grants to us so that we are prepared to walk with Jesus. Lent is a time when we trust that our journey will bring us closer to God and to one another. There is no steadfast rule about how to walk this journey, but following a Lenten practice is a good way to keep your attention focused on Jesus. Who is My Neighbor Update



# Hands and Feet of Christ: Message from Missions

Lent is an important time in the life of the church. We are urged to pray, fast, and give throughout the Lenten season. The Missions Committee is pleased to present opportunities for you to give in the weeks leading to Easter.

Missions is excited to invite our congregation to be a part of a greater movement. Medical debt is a heavy load for those who are struggling to make ends meet and then have a health crisis which adds to their financial burden. These are often the people who are most vulnerable; young families and the elderly who may have inadequate insurance or high co-pays. The Northeast Association, a section of the greater Southern

New England Conference of the UCC, is asking for 100% participation of their member churches in matching up to \$25,000 to be used to **purchase medical debt** in the New England area. Missions will be matching *your* gifts (up to \$300) to be sent to the Association. We will have a **Missions Moment** and special collection envelopes available **March 8th**; the collection will continue into April. How it works: the United Church of Christ has teamed up with the New York-based nonprofit, RIP Medical debt to locate, purchase (for pennies on the dollar) and abolish unpaid and unpayable medical debt. We will collect funds, match them, send them to be matched by the Association, and they will contribute the funds collected to the SNEUCC. It will be a flowing stream of loving generosity that will mark the beginning of the new conference.

We will have the annual special collection for **One Great Hour of Sharing on March 29th**. This year's theme is "Invest in Futures." For 70 years and more, the ecumenical One Great Hour has collected funds to serve the "least of these" among us by providing relief to those affected by catastrophic events, giving sustainable food resources to the hungry, and helping to change the structures that perpetuate poverty, oppression and injustice. Help this world-wide ministry continue their work!

Don't forget the **Lenten Underwear Drive!** Undies Sundays continue until Palm Sunday. Bring in diapers, pull-up pants, baby wipes and children's underwear to go to Communities Together for distribution to service agencies throughout the area.
