Dear Church,

"And when you turn to the right or when you turn to the left, your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying, "This is the way; walk in it." Isaiah 30:21

Matthew's gospel highlights God's presence with us. The first chapter installs Jesus here on earth with an angel connecting his birth with that which was foretold by a prophet, saying "and they shall name him Emmanuel which means 'God with us." Jesus' last words in chapter twenty-eight are "remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." Indeed this very message is sprinkled throughout Matthew's gospel.

When things are not going well, we should dwell on the promise that God is with us. At a time of pandemic, violence in the streets, and the polarization that comes during an election cycle now is a good time to remember this. Throughout time, God has been with us as God is with us now. Last year, the Sunday after Labor Day weekend saw us reunite in worship, then rally together at a delicious cook-out and surprise Pastor Debra with a cake marking her one-year anniversary at TCC. Since we can't have that same kind of celebration this year, we're offering you a chance to see Pastor Debra – and fellow TCCers – from your car as part of a Rolling Rally.

On Sunday September 13, starting at 11:00 am, Pastor Debra will stand on the top step outside the church. Members of the TCC family are invited to drive through the circle in front of the church, for a brief greeting and blessing from Pastor Debra. Please do NOT exit your vehicle at any time.

Enter the circle from Elm Street, on the side closest to Cross Street, so your driver's side window will be facing Pastor Debra. Moderator Sarah Dunlap will be directing traffic to help everyone participate safely. Honk your horns, wave to your friends, and celebrate the joy of our church family and Pastor Debra's second anniversary as our minister!

The New "Normal"

"For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." Matthew 18:20 On Sunday August 23^{rd,} the Church Council met to discuss and vote on when to reopen the sanctuary for in-person worship. The Diaconate presented the results of the survey that was in the August newsletter. The results of the survey were as follows:

17 regular attendees said YES that they would return to in person worship

17 regular attendees said NO that they were not ready to return to in-person worship.

The Diaconate recommended that we open for 1 Sunday in September and if the service goes smoothly and the public health statistics support it, we will continue to meet one Sunday per month. After a thoughtful discussion with everybody weighing in the Church Council voted unanimously to accept the recommendation made by the Diaconate.

The reasons for opening only 1 Sunday in September include finalizing what needs to be done prior to opening to keep within the guidelines set forth by the state and the recommendations of the Southern New England Conference of the UCC. The Deacons will be working on signage, marking the pews in a safe socially distant manner, preparing the sanctuary for a service of worship an example being removing all of the hymnals and pew bibles and allowing the deacons who have agreed to attend to become familiar with the guidelines to insure a smooth and seamless service. The Trustees need to develop an effective plan to clean and sanitize the sanctuary, narthex, and the upstairs bathroom.

The only areas that will be open to parishioners will be the sanctuary, the narthex, and the upstairs restroom. The only entrance to the church will be through the front doors on Elm street. The Cross street entrance will be locked. Masks are required that cover both the nose and mouth.


PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY SEPTEMBER 15th 2020, 1 to 2:30 pm


