

Dear Church,

"I am writing to you, little children, because your sins are forgiven on account of his name."

1.In 2:12

In the first letter of John, the writer makes the argument that we are forgiven simply because we are followers of Christ and because of *that*, we should repent our sins and turn from evil. This is an interesting concept, that is, that the knowledge of our forgiveness should open us up to repent our sins. This viewpoint is found elsewhere in the Bible, however the more prevalent idea and the one we are mostly familiar with is that if we repent and ask for forgiveness first, it will be granted because we asked. John is more or less saying, "By golly, you are a Christian, a follower of Christ, forgiven and loved, now go out and act like it!"

That is an interesting objective to take with us on our journey through Lent this year. What if we begin each day with an acknowledgement of the fact that we are forgiven and have *that* prompt us to act like forgiven Christians? After all, when someone gives you a gift, are you not prompted by gratitude rather than compulsion to offer thanksgiving?

Lent is a time of turning back toward God. Let's travel with Jesus knowing in advance that we are forgiven and have our words and deeds respond to that knowledge in ways that transform our lives and the lives of those around us.

A Successful 2021 Annual Meeting

TCC's first-ever virtual Annual Meeting is in the books! Thirty-five members of the church gathered on Zoom on Sunday, January 31, to review the church's 2020 Annual Report and vote on our 2021 budget and leadership slate. Once a quorum was established, and tech support Chris Lathrop explained how the meeting would work, Moderator Sarah Dunlap called the proceedings to order and offered a devotional from Psalm 121. Pastor Debra welcomed everyone, and led us in a meditation which included a passage from Jeremiah, Chapter 11.

Sarah next presented a proposed revision of the church by-laws, which would provide for an exception to Robert's Rules allowing meetings to be held via electronic software. A motion was made to change the by-law, and it was passed unanimously, allowing our Zoom meeting to proceed and all decisions and votes to be official.

The minutes of last year's meeting were accepted, and Dorothy Taylor provided the latest statistical report, including our current member count (155). Each board and committee chair then offered a brief overview of her or his annual report.

Collector Betsy Manteiga reported that the Stewardship Committee had already received 34 pledges for 2021, totaling \$61,000, but that it's not too late to pledge. Treasurer George Carifio first walked us through the 2020 balance sheet and income statement. He noted that 2020 was one of the best years financially in TCC history,

despite the pandemic. Following a few questions, George reviewed the 2021 budget. He indicated that if we spend everything budgeted, we'll have a \$52,500 deficit. But George believes we'll be able to make good decisions and come close to breaking even this year. There was a motion to accept the 2021 budget as presented, and it was approved unanimously.

Regarding the Leadership Slate, Sarah noted that Mark



Reid is joining the Diaconate and David Deems the Music Committee. She urged other members to become involved in the church by serving on boards and committees. A motion was made to accept the Leadership Slate as presented, and it was unanimously approved.

Pastor Debra offered a closing prayer, and following a motion and unanimous vote, Sarah adjourned the meeting.

Many thanks to Sarah and Dorothy for the time they devoted to preparing and mailing the Annual Report to all members prior to the meeting, as well as to Chris for helping us participate via Zoom. Hopefully, this will be not only our first remote Annual Meeting, but also our last!

6 Tablespoons butter or margarine 2 cups sifted confectioner's sugar 2/3 cup Bakers Cocoa unsweetened, powdered

1 can evaporated milk (5 ounces) Melt butter. Add sugar, cocoa, mix well. Add milk gradually beating until smooth. Bring to boil over medium heat. Cook and stir until thick, about 5 minutes. Makes 2 cups.
