Dear Church,

"I am writing to you, little children, because your sins are forgiven on account of his name." 1 Jn 2:12

Sitting down to write an article for the newsletter on a wet, dreary day after another humid heat wave, I find myself thinking about how the weather and all that comes with it has affected my sense of well-being. It feels like I've been battling the heat, the rain, the mosquitos that come with so much rain, the extraordinary number of huge and strange-looking mushrooms in our yard (not to mention the numerous rabbits who have eaten at least 7 of our hostas down to nubbins) and I'm feeling drained by it all. The global health crisis, storms and terrorist takeovers don't help my sense of well-being either!

When I talk with folks, I find that I'm not alone in all this. The hope we may have mustered in early spring has faded for many over the summer.

Yet when I think of the hope that was born to us 2000 years ago, when I think of the struggles that child endured as an adult (for you and for me), I remember that even when we can't seem to find God in the moment, God is still there. When I remember that, I think of God propping me up so I don't fall, helping me to find the good in others, helping me to realize that appreciation is oftentimes born out of struggle.

I realize that we are in no better a position than we were last fall to determine when things will get back to 'normal.' Maybe God doesn't want us to get back to normal. Maybe we were stuck in 'normal' like some comfortable couch potato too content or too lazy to get up and do what really needs to be done. What routines or norms have been shattered in your personal life? And do you want them back or have you happily replaced them with something new? It feels as though we are at a crossroads. When we stand there making our decision about the direction we will go in, will we reminisce about what is behind us or look with hope toward a future we cannot yet know, a future built with and for our God? I encourage you to think about what you've given up, what you've discovered about yourself, and what you now hope for. And when we are ready to resume some new normal, won't you share your insights with us so that together we can move into the church's new normal. May the God of hope strengthen you for the journey ahead.
